

Champ keeps improving

STUDYING for her final TEE year has not prevented Roelands teenager Jasmine Klumpp to shine at the recent Perth Open Taekwondo Championships.

The 17-year-old South West Academy of Sport scholarship holder beat tough competition to win gold in the open sparring division, continuing her stellar performance from last year when she won the under-18 category at the National titles.

Not only does Klumpp continue to hold her ranking as one of the best young taekwondo athletes in Australia, she is also working on advancing her skills and at a recent grading she obtained a third stripe on her black belt.

Klumpp is one of 20 outstanding young athletes who were awarded a South West Academy of Sport scholarship earlier this year.

The scholarship program assists outstanding young athletes to reach their potential by providing high level support, including access to specialist services such as nutritionists and sport psychologists. Klumpp said her chosen sport was never boring as there was always room to improve.

"It's not just sparring, you continue to have opportunities to improve your grade and keep moving up," she said.
