

Swimmers amass big medal tally in carnival

HUNDREDS of swimmers converged on the South West Sports Centre on Sunday for the Bunbury Swimming Club 37th annual Bunbury Open Carnival.

Bunbury Swimming Club had 52 members competing, who amassed an individual medal tally of 34 gold, 21 silver and 14 bronze, as well as winning nine gold and two bronze relay medals.

Eighteen-year-old Kate Bird won seven gold medals while Tahlia Jensen, 12, gained six gold.

Lyndon Goldsmith, 16, scored four gold in the 100m and 200m freestyle and 100m and 200m backstroke, and four silvers, while nine-year-old Sophie Mumford took four gold for the 50m breaststroke, butterfly, backstroke and freestyle.

Liam Williams, 10, earned gold in the 50m and 100m backstroke and 50m butterfly, silver for the 50m freestyle and bronze in the 100m freestyle.

Jordon Kendall, 14, won two gold and five bronze. Seventeen-year-old Ryan Evernden took gold in the 100m and 200m breaststroke and silver in 50m breaststroke, while Jacob Dubois, 13, won two gold, silver in the 50m freestyle and bronze in the 100m backstroke.

Alex Griffiths, 15, took two gold for 50m freestyle and butterfly, silver in his 50m breaststroke race and two bronze for 50m backstroke and 100m breaststroke.

Ten-year-old Amelia Mumford touched first to win gold in 100m backstroke and silver for 50m breaststroke and backstroke, while Gerred McCracken, 13, won gold in 50m freestyle.

Jessica Tan, 15, collected six silver medals, while Adele Schultz, 16, won silver for 200m breaststroke, and 12-year-old Isabel Dubois won a hat trick of bronze.

Jye Jensen and Rori Parsons, both 9, each won a bronze medal.
